

THE QUEEN

Canada is a constitutional monarchy. This means that the laws governing Canada recognize the Queen as the formal Head of State. All federal laws are made in the Queen's name. She also performs many important ceremonial duties when visiting Canada.

THE GOVERNOR GENERAL



The Governor General's Standard is a symbol of the Crown's sovereignty in Canada

The Governor General is the Queen's representative in Canada. The Queen appoints the Governor General on the advice of the Prime Minister. The Governor General usually serves for five years. One of the most important roles of the Governor General is to ensure that Canada always has a Prime Minister. For example, if no party had a clear majority after an election, or if the Prime Minister were to die in office, the Governor General would have to choose a successor.

The Governor General acts on the advice of the Prime Minister and Cabinet. The duties of the Governor General include the following: summoning, opening and ending sessions of Parliament; reading the Speech from the Throne; giving Royal Assent to bills; signing state documents; and dissolving Parliament for an election.

THE SENATE

The Senate studies, amends and either rejects or approves bills passed by the House of Commons. It can also introduce its own bills, except those to spend public money or impose taxes, which must be introduced in the House of Commons. No bill can become law until it has been passed by the Senate. Senators also study major social, legal and economic issues through their committee work.

One of the duties of the Senate is to represent the interests of Canada's regions, provinces, territories and minority groups. Seats in the Senate are distributed to give each major region of the country equal representation.

The Senate has 105 members. Senators are appointed by the Governor General on the recommendation of the Prime Minister and hold office until age 75.

HIGHLIGHTS OF SIGNIFICANT CHANGES

Below is an up-to-the-minute list of the most recent changes to higher-level government contacts in the federal, provincial and territorial governments. Please see the in-depth listings in this book for full details of departmental and personnel changes.

Federal

House of Commons

Michael Ferguson was nominated as the new Auditor General by Prime Minister Stephen Harper. If voted in, he will succeed Sheila Fraser.

Under proposed Conservative legislation (the Fair Representation Act), Québec would get three new seats in the House, Ontario would get 15 and British Columbia and Alberta would each get six. This would increase the seat-count in the Commons to 338 from its present 308.

RCMP

Prime Minister Stephen Harper appointed Bob Paulson, the RCMP's Deputy Commissioner for federal policing, as Commissioner of the RCMP, to succeed William Elliott.

Supreme Court

Two new judges were appointed to the Supreme Court: Madam Justice Andromache Karakatsanis and Mr. Justice Michael Moldaver.

Alberta

After Ed Stelmach stepped down, Alison M. Redford Q.C. was chosen as the new leader of the Progressive Conservative party and was sworn in as Alberta's 14th Premier in a ceremony at the Alberta Legislature.

Some changes to the cabinet were made shortly afterward:

- Evan Berger was sworn in as Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development. He also serves as Political Minister—Southern Alberta.
- Heather Klimchuk was appointed Minister of Culture and Community Services.
- Thomas Lukaszuk was sworn in as Minister of Education. He also serves as Political Minister—Edmonton.
- Dr. Ted Morton was appointed Minister of Energy. He also serves as a member of the Agenda and Priorities and Treasury Board committees.
- Diana McQueen was sworn in as Minister of Environment and Water. She also serves as Chair of the Regulatory Review Committee, Alberta Energy.
- Ron Liepert moved from Minister of Energy, Minister of Education and Minister of Health and Wellness to Minister of Finance.
- Fred Horne was appointed Minister of Health and Wellness. He also serves as a member of the Cabinet Policy Committee on Public Health & Safety and the Treasury Board, and of the Standing Committee on Health.
- Dave Hancock was appointed Minister of Human Services and Government House Leader.
- Jeff Johnson was sworn in as Minister of Infrastructure. He also serves as Political Minister—Northern Alberta.
- Cal Dallas was appointed Minister of Intergovernmental, International and Aboriginal Relations and Political Minister—Central Alberta.
- Doug Griffiths was sworn in as Minister of Municipal Affairs.
- George VanderBurg was sworn in as Minister of Seniors.
- Manmeet Bhullar was sworn in as Minister for Service Alberta. He also serves as Political Minister—Calgary.

British Columbia

Manitoba

In the October election, the New Democrats gained one seat and now hold a total of 37 of the 57 members, gaining their strongest majority ever in the Assembly. The Progressive Conservatives lost one seat, falling to 19, and the Liberals held their one. PC leader Hugh McFadyen announced shortly thereafter that he would resign his post.

Newfoundland and Labrador

The Progressive Conservatives won a strong majority in the October election under leader Kathy Dunderdale, who now sits as Premier. They hold 37 of the total 48 seats with the Liberals winning six to become the Official Opposition, and the New Democrats gaining four to have a total of five. The Liberals' leader of two months, Kevin Aylward, didn't win his seat. Former Liberal Party leader Yvonne Jones was re-elected to her MLA seat with 71% of the vote.
